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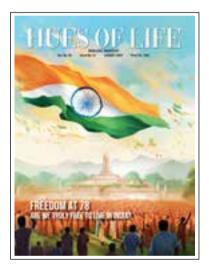
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Editor's Desk

ot every institution is born from ambition. Some are born from necessitybuilt bv individuals who see a clear gap in the system and decide to bridge it themselves. Fariz Networks in Kollam is one such institution. Ten vears ago, when its founder, Jimeris Hussain, looked around, he noticed something missing-not a lack of talent, but a lack of structured, handson education that could prepare students in South Kerala for careers in the real-world IT industry. It was not just about teaching software or networking. It was about creating a place where students, regardless of their background, could develop into professionals who could stand confidently in interviews, step into competitive tech roles, and find their own place in the digital workforce.

Fariz Networks was not built overnight. It carries the weight of a personal journey and the vision of a teacher who became a trainer, and then an entrepreneur. Jimeris Hussain, 2003-07 B.Tech а Computer Science graduate, began his career through technical certifications and corporate jobs like many others. As his early focus was on networking and cybersecurity, the fields he believed would soon become central to every industry, he trained extensively in India and the Middle East, gaining exposure in Bengaluru and Doha, not just as an employee but as a corporate trainer. But even as his career evolved, the idea of starting something of his own never left him.

When he finally founded Fariz

Networks in Kollam, it was not just the start of a business. It marked the beginning of a purposeful initiative built on vision, dedication and a commitment to meaningful education. The name Fariz, also the name of his son, was chosen to give the venture a distinct identity rooted in personal connection.

Today, Fariz Networks is a name that holds credibility in the southern Kerala education landscape. More than 3,000 students have been trained over the past decade. Over 500 have secured placements in IT companies, start-ups, and institutions across India and abroad. It shows the precise and strict filtering process of the institution to present true talents for future. But more than the numbers, what stands out is the clarity of their approach. The institute does not believe in hollow claims. There are no unrealistic banners promising "100% placement" in bold fonts. What they offer instead is honest support, professional mentoring. and access to a community that values continuous learning.

The strength of Fariz Networks lies in its course structure constantly updated, aligned with industry requirements, and delivered by trainers who know what they're doing. From foundational programs in hardware and networking to advanced tracks in cloud computing, cybersecurity, and full stack development, the curriculum is wideranging. Students can prepare for globally recognized certifications from Cisco (CCNA, CCNP, CCIE),







Microsoft (MCSA, MCSE), and Red Hat (RHCSA, RHCE), along with practical training in VMware, AWS, Microsoft Azure, and system administration.

Fariz Networks also runs intensive programs in cybersecurity, offering globally recognized credentials like CEH and ECSA, as well as practical workshops in general ethical hacking and secure infrastructure design. In the software space, the institute covers everything from C++ and .NET to emerging technologies such as Python, R, Flutter, and mobile app development. Their full stack development courses include Python-Django, Java, MERN, and MEAN, each designed to help learners become industry-ready developers with hands-on project experience.

More than an IT institute, Fariz Networks has expanded into creative domains in recent years as well. Its fashion design course, offered in Kollam, has become a flagship program that blends creativity with business awareness. Designed for aspiring designers, students, entrepreneurs, and professionals looking for a shift, the course includes garment manufacturing, textile management, design software training, fashion marketing, and portfolio development. Terracotta is completely biodegradable, sourced from nature and returned to it without harming the environment. While the Constitution guarantees freedom of speech, the reality on ground often whispers otherwise. The right to dissent is slowly becoming a privilege, and in some cases, a danger.

Technology, too, has transformed the idea freedom. While we have accesstoglobal conversations at the touch of a screen, the digital world has also become a surveillance playground. Personal data is sold, tracked, and used to shape opinions. Echo chambers reduce dialogue, and the very platforms that promised open expression are now fertile grounds for misinformation, hate, and polarization. The freedom to think critically is under pressure, and the lines between patriotism and blind loyalty are becoming increasingly blurred.

India is a land of extraordinary strength. Its soul lies in the diversity of its people and the wisdom of its ancient and evolving culture. But the time has come to confront the uncomfortable realities that continue to divide us. We cannot build a truly free India unless we are willing to listen to those who are still fighting for their piece of liberty.

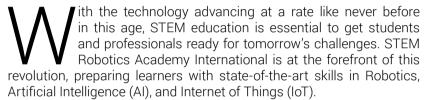

MANAPAD A COASTAL TREASURE UNFOLDED

ucked away along the southern edge of Tamil Nadu's coast lies a village where time moves gently, waves kiss the shore in rhythm, and heritage breathes through salt-tinged winds. Manapad, often overlooked in the rush of mainstream tourism, is a place of soul-soothing quietude and cultural richness. It offers not just the charm of scenic beaches and age-old churches, but also the authentic rhythm of coastal life. For travellers seeking stories, serenity, and an escape from the mechanical rush of cities, Manapad is a place waiting to be found.

The first sight that greets you as you approach Manapad is the shimmering stretch of the Bay of Bengal unfolding under a vast open sky. The beach, unspoiled and often near empty, stretches with a sense of calm that is rare on more popular shores. There are no noisy water sports or commercial stalls here. Instead, you find fishermen mending their nets, children chasing waves, and boats gently rocking along the shore. The sea here is generous and calm, its moods shifting only slightly with the breeze. Early mornings are particularly magical, as the sky softens into streaks of amber and rose, and the first boats begin their journey into the horizon.

Manapad's heart lies not only in its coastline but in its history. One of the most notable landmarks is the Holy Cross Church, perched on a cliff that gazes over the sea. This church has stood for centuries, its white facade weathered by salt winds and sunlight, yet unwavering in dignity. Built in the 16th century by Portuguese missionaries, it has become a place of pilgrimage, especially in September when the Exaltation of the Holy Cross festival is celebrated. The relic of the True Cross is said to have been brought here, giving the village its spiritual significance.

Walking through the village, you notice the influence of both Tamil and Portuguese cultures. The architecture carries remnants of colonial pasts, with houses that have arched doors, colourful walls, and tiled roofs. There is a gentle blend of traditions here. Local Christian festivals are celebrated with as much joy as the coastal Hindu rituals. The people of Manapad are warm and welcoming. Visitors are often greeted with quiet smiles and curious glances, and it is not unusual to be offered a plate of freshly fried fish or a cup of spiced tea from someone's veranda.

The fishing community forms the lifeblood of Manapad. Unlike modern mechanised harbours, the village continues with traditional fishing methods. Wooden boats are pushed into the sea with collective effort, and the return is welcomed by the community with the same enthusiasm each time. The fish markets in the early morning are an experience in themselves. Vibrant, energetic, and full of chatter, these markets reveal the day's catch in gleaming silver and vibrant hues. From pearl spot and mackerel to crab and squid, the bounty of the sea supports not just food but culture.

Food in Manapad is simple and memorable. Fresh seafood, spiced with local flavours, is the mainstay of the kitchen. The use of coconut, tamarind, curry leaves, and freshly ground masalas lends each dish its own identity. A meal of rice, meen kuzhambu, and fried fish eaten under a thatched roof as the sea breeze drifts in is

something that stays with you long after you leave.

For those with an interest in heritage, Manapad is a quiet archive of stories. The village finds mention in Christian lore, notably the journey of St. Francis Xavier. He is believed to have lived here for some time, preaching and serving the local people. His footprints remain not just in church records but in the faith and oral history of the villagers. Some of the pathways he is said to have walked still remain untouched, now covered with quiet trees and flowering bushes. These stories are not tourist material but live in the words of elders who speak of them not as myths, but memories.

While the village maintains its old-world charm, it is not frozen in time. There is a slow but steady rise in awareness of sustainable tourism. A few homestays have begun to emerge, run by locals who wish to share their slice of paradise without disturbing its soul. These homestays offer more than just a bed. They invite you to cook with the family, to join fishing trips, and to sit by the shore listening to age-old folk songs. There are no hotel bells or room service menus. Instead, there are stories, starlit nights, and the scent of the sea on everything.

Manapad's geographical location also makes it a quiet point of connection to other scenic parts of Tamil Nadu. It lies close to the town of Tiruchendur, known for its grand temple by the sea. A short drive can also take you to the sand dunes of Uvari, or the lively markets of

Tuticorin. Yet, even when the options are many, most visitors find themselves returning to Manapad's own shores each evening, drawn back by its tranquillity.

The best time to visit Manapad is between October and February, when the sun is gentler, and the sea is at its most inviting. During festival times, especially the Holy Cross celebrations, the village becomes vibrant with processions, prayers, and community feasts. For a visitor, it is a chance to witness devotion expressed not through grandeur but heartfelt rituals and togetherness.

Nature, history, and culture meet in Manapad with an effortless grace. It is not a place of grand hotels or glamorous attractions. Rather, it offers something far more enduring. A chance to reconnect with simplicity. A moment to watch the sun dip into the sea without a camera lens between you and the view. An opportunity to walk through sand with no footsteps ahead of you.

In a world that chases pace and polish, Manapad reminds us of the beauty of slowing down. It asks nothing of you but attention. And in return, it gives stories to carry, silences to treasure, and a longing to return.

Whether you are a traveller in search of peace, a pilgrim seeking meaning, or simply someone curious about corners of the country still held by human hands, Manapad is waiting.

DR. MEERA A

UNLOCKING HUMAN POTENTIAL THROUGH SCIENCE AND SELF-AWARENESS

n expert psychologist, NLP practitioner and Director of Zoechea Wellbeing Centre, Dr. Meera A., began her professional journey not in a clinic, but in a classroom. For over a decade, she taught chemistry, working closely with students and noticing an unsettling pattern. Beyond the academic grind, many children lacked happiness and essential life skills. A teacher handling a single subject could not address the broad spectrum of issues children faced.

Her perspective began to change when she was given the opportunity to conduct career guidance sessions for students. Through these interactions, she realised a worrying truth: a generation of children was growing up in stressful, examination driven environments, often with emotionally unavailable parents. The result was a steady erosion of emotional resilience and life skills.

This realisation took her to Bangalore, where she became the Research Head for three schools, focusing on ways to enhance the overall quality of education. Here, she explored Howard Gardner's Multiple Intelligence Theory, recognising that education should be activity based and nurture all intelligences, not just academic ones. Over two years, she designed and tested programmes that trained teachers, parents and students to make learning both engaging and holistic. This work proved to be her professional turning point.

It was during this period that she encountered the Dermatoglyphics Multiple Intelligence Test (DMIT), a scientific method of decoding genetic potential through fingerprint analysis. Recognising its value, Dr. Meera became the first to introduce the DMIT tool in Kerala, founding Zoechea Wellbeing Centre in Kochi in 2013 as a counselling and personal development hub.

The DMIT tool, she explains, is a holistic life mapping instrument that reveals an individual's innate personality traits, intelligence types, tendencies and sources of happiness. Once these inborn potentials are identified, guiding a person, whether child or adult, towards the right path becomes far more effective. It is not just about improving academic performance.

It is about preventing depression, identifying talents and nurturing the genius in each person. While her early years with DMIT were met with limited public understanding, her 2016 doctorate from KEISIE University, South Korea and subsequent international publications helped spread awareness and credibility.

Dr. Meera's qualifications extend far beyond psychology. She is a Certified Multiple Intelligence Expert, a Train the Trainer specialist trained by Blair Singer, a Certified NLP Practitioner (ABNLP, IHA), and holds certifications in Reiki (Levels I to III),





Sujok therapy, Heartfulness Meditation, Pranic Healing, Quantum Mind Science, yoga training and nutritional science. She has also completed the Cambridge International Diploma for Teachers and Trainers and a Foundation Course on Education for Children with Learning Disabilities. Her expertise includes cognitive behavioural therapy (CBT), energy psychology, positive psychology and various neuroscientific approaches for mind body integration.

Her work at Zoechea spans therapy, career guidance, corporate training, and leadership development. She has conducted workshops for Fortune 500 companies like Applied Materials, as well as for IT firms, hotels and top educational institutions. Topics range from stress management and work life balance to NEP implementation, multiple intelligence in education and mind power training.

In her practice, Dr. Meera differentiates between clinical therapy for diagnosed mental illnesses and life coaching or mentoring for individuals facing everyday struggles. While psychometric assessments have their place, she emphasises that biometric assessments like DMIT can reveal a person's natural blueprint, allowing interventions to align with how the brain is wired. Nurturing what the brain already responds to, she says, creates a more balanced and fulfilled life.

She has trained batches of psychologists, stressing that before applying a therapy to clients, a practitioner must first apply it to themselves. Self-work, she believes, is non-negotiable for any psychologist. "What a psychologist cannot do for themselves, they cannot offer to the person in front of them," she says. This philosophy underpins her own two decades of engagement with human potential, a study she calls endless.

Zoechea's reach has expanded steadily. What began in Kochi in 2013 is now in its twelfth year, with a branch in Bengaluru since 2020. Her clientele includes individuals and couples from

across India and abroad. As a relationship coach, she has successfully resolved cases even through online sessions, with couples committing to a structured therapeutic process. She has also created a complete therapy procedure in video format for remote clients.

Her experiences in abnormal psychology have been equally striking. She recalls working with individuals who misinterpreted psychological symptoms as paranormal experiences and cases where phobias were resolved in months through targeted interventions.

For Dr. Meera, well-being begins with self-awareness. She rejects the notion that self-awareness is selfish. Instead, she sees it as the foundation for contributing positively to society. Self-love, she explains, is like filling your own cup before pouring into others. True well-being involves not only doing what you enjoy but also aligning your thoughts, emotions and body to maintain physical, emotional and mental balance. Without this alignment, the body and mind begin to control us, rather than the other way around.

Her definition of success is refreshingly simple. It is not about grand milestones, but about handling each day with stability and balance. "If you can live one day empowered, in physical, mental, emotional, and spiritual balance, you have succeeded that day," she says. A self-aware person can find joy in every moment and that, she believes, is the truest measure of success. Relationships, careers and achievements are only parts of it. The real victory is being able to stay present, resilient and at peace.

Through Zoechea Wellbeing Centre, Dr. Meera continues to merge science and compassion, offering people the tools to understand themselves deeply, manage their challenges and live more intentional lives. Her journey from a chemistry teacher to a global trainer and psychologist exemplifies a powerful truth. When knowledge meets empathy, transformation becomes not just possible but inevitable.

A JOURNEY OF HOPE, FAITH AND LEARNING WITH SJ PROCEDO



stablished in 2015, SJ Procedo is a centre based in Ernakulam that offers focused academic support and intervention for children with learning disorders. At the core of its vision and operations is Suni Jolly, the founder and director, whose background in special education, counselling psychology and instructional training has shaped the institution's comprehensive approach to inclusive education.

From the beginning, SJ Procedo has worked on the principle that learning must be individualised. The centre designs Individual Learning Plans (ILPs) for each student, tailored to their specific challenges and strengths. Instead of using generic academic models, SJ Procedo builds foundational skills through structured and measured intervention. The primary focus is on improving reading, writing, and comprehension, with subject-specific remediation available in English, Mathematics, Hindi and Science.

Since opening its doors, the centre has supported more than 500 students, offering both offline and online sessions. Many of these learners arrive at the centre after facing consistent academic hurdles in mainstream environments often misunderstood, under-supported or incorrectly labelled. At SJ Procedo, the aim is not only to close academic gaps but also

to restore self-confidence, address behavioural challenges, and equip children with strategies to manage their learning independently.

This work is grounded in the expertise of Suni Jolly, who brings a rare and interdisciplinary skill set to the field. A qualified special educator, she is also trained in Gestalt therapy, Transactional Analysis, NLP (Neuro-Linguistic Programming), Jolly Phonics, EFT (Emotional Freedom Technique) and Acupressure. These overlapping disciplines allow her to understand children beyond their academic needs like addressing emotional, psychological and sensory aspects that often accompany learning difficulties.

One of SJ Procedo's notable contributions has been in the area of awareness and capacity-building. Identifying a gap in the training of teachers and caregivers dealing with learning disabilities, Suni Jolly designed a six-week course on Learning Disabilities. The programme is aimed at special educators, parents, and other stakeholders who wish to support children more effectively. To date, around 100 participants have completed the course, gaining both theoretical insights and hands-on strategies related to assessment, classroom support and behavioural interventions.

The centre, located at Kacheripadi in Ernakulam, operates with a compact team but makes a large impact. During and after the pandemic, SJ Procedo expanded its digital presence, allowing it to offer classes online to students across different regions. This shift to a hybrid model has since become a permanent fixture, giving families access to specialised support without geographical limitations.

Sessions are short, targeted, and adapted to the learner's pace. The staff is trained to observe subtle cues like signs of fatigue, anxiety, disengagement and modify instruction accordingly. For children who have been in rigid or performance-driven environments, this flexibility is a turning point. They are not pushed to keep up with a class, but instead taught to understand their own learning rhythm.

The philosophy behind SJ Procedo reflects Suni Jolly's broader engagement with the field of education. Beyond her directorship, she regularly conducts seminars, workshops, and presentations on brain-based education, effective parenting, student behaviour management, token economy systems, and more. Her sessions have been featured in forums including Snaha Sadan College of Special Education,

Rajagiri College of Psychology, and naval public schools, among others. These engagements aim to build a wider understanding that learning disorders are not indicators of intelligence or capability, but simply a call for different instructional methods.

India's educational framework is still in the process of becoming fully inclusive. While policies exist, implementation is inconsistent, and awareness around learning disabilities remains limited in many regions. In such a context, SJ Procedo's work is both practical and pioneering. It demonstrates that with the right interventions, children previously written off as underachievers can thrive academically and personally.

Looking ahead, SJ Procedo's goals include strengthening its educator training programmes, deepening partnerships with schools for early identification, and incorporating newer tools in digital assessments. However, its core remains unchanged: to ensure that no child's potential is missed because their learning didn't fit the conventional mould.

For Suni Jolly, the progress children make at SJ Procedo is not explained by methods and training alone. She attributes every breakthrough to the quiet but undeniable hand of God. Time and again, she has seen children in the most difficult situations begin to flourish at just the right moment and she calls that timing divine. To honour and preserve that grace, she approaches her work with physical readiness, mental clarity and a spirit anchored in prayer, ensuring that faith remains at the heart of every step forward.

Through SJ Procedo, Suni Jolly has created more than just a centre for remediation. She has built a platform where education is redefined as individualised, compassionate and deeply respectful of every learner's journey.

AL RUBA

A SPICE STORY ROOTED IN PASSION, GROWING BEYOND BORDERS





n the village of Madhur in Kasaragod, a unique spice brand began its journey, not with a grand launch or a marketing campaign, but through years of quiet dedication. Al Ruba, founded by K.B. Muneer, stands as a testament to how sincere intent and consistent quality can create something that resonates across regions and cultures.

Before Al Ruba came into existence, Muneer spent over two decades working in the Gulf, steadily rising through the ranks in fast-food chains. From chef to supervisor to operations manager, he gained hands-on experience in food preparation, customer behaviour, and service logistics. Yet behind the fast-paced nature of his job, Muneer held on to a personal vision, one that didn't revolve around restaurants or franchises but a single, standout product: a fried chicken masala that could deliver bold, comforting flavour using honest, high-quality ingredients.

His idea stemmed from observation. Over the years, he noticed how the flavour of well-seasoned fried chicken brought people joy. The delight, he realized, wasn't just in the crunch, it was in the spice. During his off hours, he began experimenting: blending, adjusting, and perfecting the ratios. There was no rush. His approach was patient and deliberate, guided by the belief that good flavour takes time.

When Muneer eventually returned to Kerala, he continued refining his masala while working briefly at a friend's restaurant. The kitchen became his testing ground, and customer feedback became his compass. One evening, he served fried chicken seasoned with his final blend. The response was immediate and enthusiastic. People began asking where they could buy the masala. That moment marked the informal launch of Al Ruba.

The name was deeply personal 'Ruba' was Muneer's daughter's name, and 'Al' was added to give the brand a broader yet grounded identity. From the start, Al Ruba was defined by a clear purpose: no added MSG, no artificial colours, and no shortcuts. Only pure, carefully sourced spices, blended in small batches to preserve authenticity and freshness.

Muneer started small, distributing to local stores in Kasaragod. The initial batches sold quickly, and word spread organically. Customers returned not just for fried chicken, but to use the blend in grills, marinades, and gravies. Soon, restaurants and caterers took notice, and demand grew steadily.

Al Ruba scaled up without compromising its founding principles. The brand introduced both retail packs for home kitchens and bulk quantities for commercial buyers. Muneer's operational experience helped streamline the supply chain, ensuring reliable distribution while maintaining quality.

Today, Al Ruba has found its way into homes and restaurants across Kerala and other Indian states. It has also reached international markets, including the Gulf countries, Malaysia, New Zealand, and the United States. Yet the brand's growth has remained organic driven by trust, quality, and word of mouth.

For Muneer, success isn't measured by numbers alone. It's reflected in the photos families share of meals made with Al Ruba masala, and in the way small eateries proudly display the packets in their kitchens. This emotional connection with customers is what truly sets the brand apart. More than just a spice mix, Al Ruba embodies a grounded approach to entrepreneurship — one that values patience, consistency, and honest flavour. Muneer never rushed into mass production or aggressive branding. Instead, he focused on the product, allowing its quality to speak for itself.

Looking ahead, Al Ruba is preparing to expand its range thoughtfully. Plans include introducing spice rubs, marinades, and traditional Kerala blends but only when they meet the same uncompromising standards. For Muneer, the guiding principle remains unchanged: flavour that feels honest, and products that can be trusted.

In a market often crowded with loud branding and artificial additives, Al Ruba stands out by doing the opposite, quietly delivering on its promises. Rooted in tradition, refined by experience, and built with integrity, Al Ruba continues to grow from a small village in Kasaragod to kitchens around the world.

WHERE BRIDAL COUTURE FINDS ITS AURA

hen some brands are born out of market research, some others are born out of need. But a few, like Living Featherstone, are born from a personal moment of revelation an unmet expectation that sparks a desire to fill the space with an exceptional brand.

When Justin Sebastian and Sharlet N. Shaji were preparing for their wedding, they were struck by a startling realization: Kerala, despite its deep cultural roots and aesthetic sensibilities, had few options when it came to true bridal couture. In those years, wedding gowns were still an unfamiliar territory for many. The designs available locally were often mistaken for holy communion dresses-simple, basic and lacking the elegance and grandeur associated with a bride's big day. What should have been a joyful search for the perfect wedding ensemble turned instead into a guest that revealed a clear gap in the market.

During a visit to Chennai, the couple walked into a boutique in Chennai unlike anything they had seen before-tastefully curated, professionally styled, and artistically elevated. It wasn't just the gowns that impressed them, but the mood, the space, the entire atmosphere that spoke of celebration and sophistication. It was the kind of place they wished existed back home. The idea lingered. What if they brought that experience to Kerala not just as a boutique, but as a bridal fashion destination?

Justin, who was then working in technical support at Microsoft and Sharlet, whose creative instincts were sharpened by their shared design sensibilities, began putting together what would eventually become Living Featherstone-a bridal boutique that would offer

something Kerala had never seen before: couturelevel craftsmanship, a deep respect for personal style and a completely customized experience.

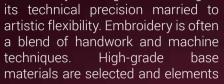
Launched in Changanacherry, Living Featherstone quickly grew beyond the conventional image of a boutique. This wasn't a rack-to-trial operation. Every gown that left their hands was one-of-a-kind, made to measure, and designed in close collaboration with the bride herself. From the very first consultation, the brand stood apart for its intimate, process-driven approach. Some clients arrived with Pinterest boards and fabric samples, others came with no clear idea at all. Regardless, each consultation became a dialogue about design, silhouette, embroidery, fabric movement and most importantly, emotion.





The boutique operates both offline and online, with equal commitment to detail. In-store appointments are immersive, allowing brides to feel the textures, see the details and experience the creative journey first-hand. Online consultations-more time-intensive by nature-are handled with care. It may take some days just to finalize a design remotely. Yet nothing is rushed. Measurements are guided through video calls, with someone from the bride's side being coached to take precise measurements under the team's supervision. Every inch matters. Every stitch is made to last.

What truly distinguishes Living Featherstone is



like zippers and inner linings are never compromised. In many cases, plain fabrics are transformed through advanced stitching techniques to create textures that feel exclusive and refined. Some gowns include personalized elements like initials, symbols, even motifs that reflect cultural identities, all seamlessly integrated into the design.

As India becomes increasingly multicultural in its celebrations, the boutique also receives requests rooted in global traditions—Sri Lankan wedding styles, for instance, or Western silhouettes with Eastern nuances. These are not copied, but interpreted. The aim is never to dilute cultural essence, but to honour

it, elevate it and make it personal.

Behind every gown is a team trained not just in tailoring, but in understanding moments. They are artists, listeners, advisors, and perfectionists. The final result is not just a garment—it's an heirloom in the making.

Though Living Featherstone remains a bridal-exclusive brand, the founders have also launched a parallel fashion line: MOSSES VIBES, which focuses on designer wear outside the wedding space. Based

in Newington, USA, and expanding soon into the UK, this label caters to global fashion tastes, with in-house production and exports. Still, bridal fashion remains closest to their heart. As Justin puts it, "When you stay in the bridal industry, you're constantly evolving. Brides are never the same. And neither are their dreams."

In a world of mass production, Living Featherstone stands for something slower, finer, more meaningful. It is a place where love stories are stitched with precision, where fabric carries memory, and where a bride doesn't just wear a dress—she becomes it.

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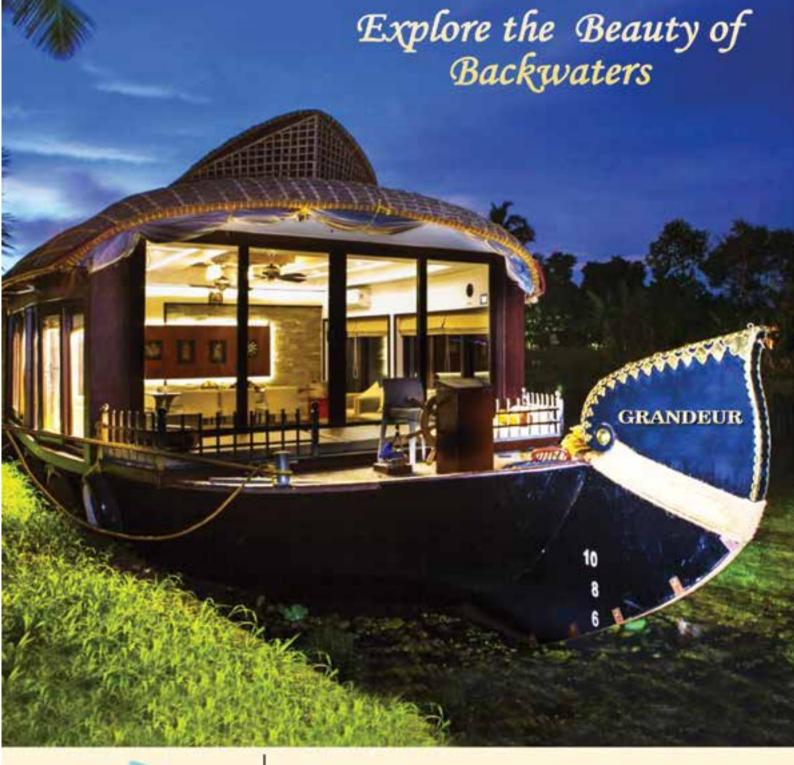
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
